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YS4CPM 580 Center – Housing Authority Impact Summary Report (Q2)

The 580 Center, operated by Youth Services for Choctaw, Pushmataha, and McCurtain Counties (YS4CPM), continues to serve as a vital community hub for youth engagement, support services, and prevention programming. 580 Center operates on a fiscal year beginning in **July**. Between October and December, the center supported an estimated 90 students through a variety of impactful programs and outreach efforts.

The 580 Center remains a safe and supportive space for youth throughout the Hugo Housing Authority community. Of the 90 youth served across 8 distinct programs, 90 students (76%) **received direct housing-related support as residents or through immediate family connections to housing assistance. It should be noted that some students are represented in multiple programs, as youth often participate in more than one offering at the center. This duplication reflects the depth of engagement and the comprehensive nature of services provided to meet their diverse needs.**

The success of these efforts is further strengthened through YS4CPM's valued partnership with the Hugo Housing Authority, which plays a key role in expanding access to housing-related resources and supporting the overall stability and development of youth and their families.

Positive Outcomes

- **Access to Services:** Over 76% of youth were directly connected to a safe space or ongoing support services, significantly reducing barriers to stability and access to basic needs.
- **Family Assistant Programming:** Family-focused assistance contributed to strengthened support systems for youth and during the Christmas season.
- **Youth Leadership Growth:** Programs such as Buffalo Academy, YAC, YouthBuild, and Teambuilding fostered youth leadership, peer accountability, and a strengthened connection to civic responsibility and community service.
- **Engagement Opportunities:** Programming such as mentoring, and civic clubs, introduced creative, pro-social, and substance-free outlets that encouraged youth engagement and positive identity development.
- **Upcoming Activities** are scheduled to enhance youth and family engagement.
- **Access to an emergency food bank** has been established, providing critical resources to address immediate community needs as requested.

The 580 Center continues to be a resource in young people's lives, offering immediate support and long-term skills. Through intentional outreach, comprehensive programming, and trusted partnerships—including with the Hugo Housing Authority—YS4CPM remains committed to building strong, resilient youth empowered to grow, lead, and thrive.
